RICHMOND, VA— This year, twelve students from communities managed by the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority (RRHA) will be attending college. Three of these of students have won scholarships from the Virginia Association of Housing and Community Development Officials (VAHCDO) to help pay tuition. An additional nine have been accepted to four-year colleges and universities to further their education.
